Department Highlights

Press Releases

The seat belt grant that Sheriff's Office had applied for through State of Maine's Department of Highway Safety was awarded. The Madison Division is set to commence on May 26th, and would be in addition to any regular patrol. The OUI/Speed detail grants, are still ongoing at this time as well.

In March's Report we reported that Deputy Morris had submitted 3 names for referral for Camp Postcard from Madison, unfortunately none were selected. Camp Postcard received over 400 applications for camper referrals and had limited openings for campers.

Prescription drug take back day was held at several sites throughout the County on Saturday March 30th. The Madison Division participated in the drug take back initiative from 10-2. The Drug take back Program was very successful ,and resulted in 749 pounds of unwanted prescription medications County wide. The Madison Division contributed 42 pounds of unwanted prescription medications.

Deputy Libby Participated at Career day, which took place on March 27th at the Madison High School.

On April 9th Waterville Police Department initiated a pursuit of a motor vehicle that proceeded through several towns in Somerset County. Deputy Merry was with her Field Training Officer Deputy Toby Blodgett, in the town of Madison at the time of the incident. Both Deputies never actively participated in any pursuing of the suspect s vehicle. The Deputies were able to successfully deploy the the spike mat on Preble Avenue, that subsequently stopped the suspect vehicle. Sgt. Matthew Bard from Fairfield Police took custody of the suspect ,Orlando Perkins of Mercer.

Personnel

Deputy Tad Nelson, and Deputy Chelsea Merry both finished the final Field Training officer phase in April. The Madison Division Schedule has now been set for the 12hour shifts, for active 24 hour coverage to start on May 1st. The Madison now has a full compliment of Five Deputies.

Patrol Coverage

During the month of April Deputy Lafreniere was called out three times. These calls consisted of a Domestic Disturbance from Old County Road. A car vs. deer motor vehicle accident on Park St. A drug overdose on Main St. that resulted in a male subject that ended up being transported to a Boston Hospital for further medical care.
