## Department Highlights

### Press Releases

November 17<sup>th</sup> Deputy John Morris resigned his position to accept an employment opportunity with a company in Augusta. The Madison Division wishes him well in his new endeavor.

November 29<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Lafreniere assisted Principal Ward with conducting a lock-down drill at the Madison High School. It was reported that the lock-down drill went well.

Sharon in conjunction with a U.S. Cellular representative worked together to merge the original police cell phone plan, into the County cell phone plan. This merger enabled the Madison Division to obtain individual cell phones, at a cost less than the previous, which was for the 2 cruiser phones. Madison Deputies have been assigned individual cell phones, which will enhance communications between Madison Deputies and the public. This will assist the Deputies in multiple areas, first being a safety issue as an alternative form of communications. A Second use is for their investigative purposes such as photos and recordings, both audio and visual applications.

### Training / Other

November 9<sup>th</sup>, Deputies attended a mandatory Patrol Meeting held at the Sheriff's Office.

November 21<sup>st</sup> Deputies Lafreniere, Merry and Nelson all completed weapons training and certification. Madison Deputies now carry the new Glock, model 21 sidearm, which is a .45 caliber handgun. These new handguns, replace the .45 H&K which were in excess of 12 years old.

There were five call outs for the month of November : they consisted of two separate motor vehicle accidents, both being car vs. deer, a suspicious person complaint, a 9-1-1 misdial and 9-1-1 hang up.

### Vehicle out of town

November 16<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Merry responded to a suspicious person complaint on the Lakewood Rd. in the roadway. For the subject's safety, she gave the subject a ride to his group home in Skowhegan.

November 27<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Nelson assisted Corporal G.Cole with a disturbance call on Main St. Anson. Deputy Nelson checked an address on the Walker Rd. Norridgewock, for a suspect involved in serious personal injury accident.

November 30<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Nelson went to Casino Hill Trading Post in Skowhegan, for a follow up on a felony theft case that originated in Madison.
