Department Highlights

Press Releases

Both Cruisers, Unit 1 and Unit 2, have all of the equipment installed and no issues to report with the new electronic devices. This includes the new mobile tablets, the enhanced Watchguard video system, and the mobile printers.

On August 15th Deputy Libby commenced his 18 weeks at Maine Criminal Justice Academy in Vassalboro, for the BLETP (Basic Law Enforcement training program). Graduation is tentatively scheduled for Friday, December 16 2016.

The Town of Madison has hired Deputy Tyler Lafreniere to for the position of the Animal Control Officer, in his off-duty time. The Madison Division will augment the ACO ,and will assist with any emergency animal situation that may arise.

On August 3rd, Deputy Libby was dispatched to do a welfare check for a 39 year old female on Bean St. It was reported that she had not been heard from in several days. Deputy Libby, who is the primary investigator, with the assistance of Deputy Dyer responded to the scene. Upon arrival Deputy Libby discovered the female had been deceased for some time. The body was brought to the Medical Examiner's office for an autopsy. The medical examiner's report advised that foul play does not appear to be involved.

On August 9th, Deputy Merry responded to a single motor vehicle rollover crash on the Lakewood Rd. Deputy Merry is the primary investigator, with the assistance of Corporal David Cole. The driver and only occupant sustained a head injury, and was taken to Redington Fairview General Hospital and then later transferred to Maine Medical Center for treatment. During the course of the investigation, it was determined the operator's young dog that had been in the vehicle had ran from the scene. With the assistance of the Maine Lost Dog Recovery, and the owner's constant search the dog was subsequently found after 2 weeks in the woods. They had set out game a camera, and food inside a live trap and he eventually went into it. The dog had an injury to its paw and was very emaciated. The owners were very happy to have the dog returned. The Cause of the crash was determined to be due to distracted driving.

On August 27th Deputy Morris conducted a Speed Detail (funded through the Highway Safety Grant) on the Lakewood road from the hours of 10:00 to 14:00, and issued 7 speed warnings, and 1 summons.

On August 25th-28th the Madison Division was happy to assist with many of the Madison-Anson day events that were offered. The Madison Division reports that there were no issues associated with the Madison Anson day events. The Madison Division offered free lemonade and water bottles on Friday the 26th.

Training / Other

On-line JPMA (Justice Planning and Management Associates) training. This ongoing mandatory training is facilitated through the MCJA, and is completed annually for Certification.

Vehicle out of town

August 1st Deputy Lafreniere assisted in Anson, for a 9-1-1 call for a report of a pedestrian who was stumbling in the roadway by the fire station, and was unable to locate and cleared.

August 18th Deputy Lafreniere assisted in Anson, in reference to a 9-1-1 call reporting juveniles breaking into a shed, which turned out to be unfounded, they were skateboarding in the area, and being very loud.

August 22nd Deputy Lafreniere assisted in Solon, (Rt 201 Robbins Hill area which is approximately 1/10 mile over the line) with the report of a large piece of tire debris in the roadway, it was gone on his arrival.
