The New 2016 Cruiser is now the primary Unit 1. Both Unit 1 and Unit 2 are fully equipped with the new mobile data tablets, and unit 2 has the mobile printer up and running in it. Unit 1 printer is scheduled to be installed shortly.

This Mobile printing feature is a great tool that will enable the automatic printing of critical documents with no wait time. One very important feature is that the Deputies will now be able print out any protection orders that have not yet been served, but are in the Metro system awaiting service. Previously these were able to be viewed, however, there was no capability to have orders printed in the cruisers.

Deputies will now also be able to print the Harassment/Trespass notices that need to be served.

July 15th-17th, a successful Alternative sentencing program (offered through Somerset County Jail) was completed at the Madison Junior High. The New program is a first of its kind and is only open to those with misdemeanor and nonviolent convictions. The participant pays a fee to to the County, and in return perform community service, and receives counseling as well. This particular program which was overseen by County Jail Programs Manager's Mike Welch, and SCCCP Supervisor Teresa Brown. The first ASP (alternative sentencing program) included four participants that repainted the former industrial arts center. The work saved the Madison taxpayers approximately \$1,100 in labor costs.

The State Metro system had made the decision to discontinue with the original Madison Police Department ORI, since the Sheriff's Office has always been the Primary ORI, and any municipality within the County would have been issued an ORI with that. ORI (Originating Record Indicator) are Nationwide and issued through the Federal Government to each law enforcement agency across the Country that use the system. This is important when the FBI does their auditing of the system, and assures complete accuracy. Due to this change in the Metro system, the Sheriff made the transition in the CAD (computer aided dispatch) computer system (IMC) to merge Madison into Somerset, for the ease of record keeping. The merging of the systems, in turn will now save annual maintenance fees that are paid to the CAD vendor IMC.

Madison ACO Dave Huff has stepped down from the position, as of now the Deputies are assisting the town with handling the calls until a replacement has been located.

July 2nd, Deputy Libby was dispatched for a welfare check on Bean St, for a 31 year old female. On arrival they discovered that she had been deceased for some time, and appeared to be a drug overdose. Corporal Putnam was primary on the investigation and State Police Major crimes were also notified.

July 22nd Deputy Nelson did a speed detail from the hours of 1600-2000 hours. He initiated five motor vehicle stops for speed that resulted in issuing four warnings, and one citation.

July 29th Deputy Merry received a report of a multiple vehicle crash at Clough's corner. She is primary with the assistance of Corporal Putnam. There were 2 moving motor vehicles involved, and 3 parked vehicles (Hight Chrysler/Jeep Dealership). The offending vehicle that caused the crash operated by Randall Brackett, age 31 from Madison, who was subsequently arrested on multiple charges. The Female driver of the other vehicle sustained minor injuries, and also had her 2 small children in the vehicle, and they also sustained minor injuries. There were multiple witnesses to the crash, and many bystanders stopped to help before the responders could arrive. Deputy Merry's investigation is still on-going at this time.
